Skills will include growing their own food, making tools, team work, taking controlled risks, cooking on open fire etc. We are extremely excited by this and as you can imagine we have a lot to do initially setting up to ensure the children have the best experience possible. We have continued to work with the Melissa Hatton Trust to ensure the area is tidy; the next stage is to get all the equipment and setup as required. We have raised beds to build and a pond to dig out etc therefore, we may call on you for some assistance and any help would be appreciated.

Staff lists for the next academic year will be shared with you towards the end of term.





If you require support with morning routines for your child please speak to the class teacher.
