New reading and phonics scheme



I wrote to you to inform you of how reading really can make a difference to children's successes in school and beyond. I am happy to tell you that our new reading scheme, accelerated reader, is up and running. Children will no longer move through the colours as they have done in the past. Instead children will be tested each half term and be given a reading range for books they can read successfully. After they have read each book there is an accompanying quiz of 5-10 questions to ensure they have understood what they have read, this can be taken at home or at school. Mr Dean has sent a letter with all the information you need including logging on arrangements, this can be found on Class Dojo. If your child reads a book that is not from our library, the chances are there will be a quiz which links to it.

To the support **Accelerated reader scheme** the school is also launching a new phonics scheme called **'Little Wandle'** in Key stage 1 and EYFS. I have been evaluating the current scheme and although our children can decode words, some really struggled to understand what they have read. Therefore using 'Little Wandle' scheme, children with have their daily phonics sessions as required depending on their year group, but this scheme has additional levelled decodable books directly attached to your child's ability. In practice what this means is they will receive 3 additional small group reading sessions each week, where they should become fluent in the language of the chosen book and reflect on the content by being able to answer questions. Each week they will receive a new book which will be sent home with them but not until the have read it **3 times** in school with an adult, the book is then to be returned each **Monday** when is will be passed onto the next reading group. An additional reading for pleasure book will be sent home for those accessing the 'Little Wandle' scheme. This scheme has been approved by the DFE as systematically teaching children to read. ALL staff including myself have been trained in its administration as early reading is the biggest factor in improving future perspective job opportunities and social mobility. There will be some children in Key stage 2 who have some sessions on the scheme to raise their confide nce in their own ability and re-learn some of the teaching sounds as required. The Scheme also has a whole host of resources to support staff and parents with teaching reading including videos to support learners which could be used if we have to move to remote learning.



The School requires you to **contact the office before 8:30am** if your child is going to be absent for any reason. We will **no longer** be allowing absence to be communicated via Class Dojo as this can be missed by the office, who has to send information off to relevant agencies. Please phone the school on **01623 624709** stating your child's name and reason for absence. If we do not hear from you, we will attempt to call you, if there is no answer we will have to come out to **your house** to ensure the child is safe via a welfare check.
